Cotton

Soft and breathable. However, it wrinkles easily and retains moisture.

Polyester

Durable and wrinkle-resistant. But, less breathable than cotton.

Blends

A balance of comfort and durability. For example, a 65% polyester / 35% cotton blend.

Spandex/Stretch

Enhanced mobility and form-fitting. It wicks moisture. For example, 90% polyester, 10% spandex.

Consider climate, work environment, and personal preferences when selecting fabric. Moisture-wicking fabrics can reduce skin temperature by up to 2 degrees Fahrenheit during physical activity.

Finding the Right Fit: Styles for Every Body

Classic Fit

Traditional, loose-fitting style.

Modern Fit

Slightly more tailored, streamlined silhouette.

Athletic Fit

Designed for movement. Often with stretch panels.

Jogger Scrubs

Tapered leg and cuffed ankles. Popular for a sporty look.

Check size charts from different brands. Size discrepancies can vary. Functional features include drawstrings, elastic waistbands, and adjustable closures. Read customer reviews to gauge sizing accuracy.



Pockets and Features: Functionality Matters



Chest Pockets

For pens, ID badges, and small tools.



Cargo Pockets

Spacious. Often with extra compartments for phones and notepads.



Back Pockets

Similar to pants pockets, for personal items.



Instrument Loops

For holding scissors, hemostats, and other tools.

Other features include badge loops, pen slots, and zippered pockets. Healthcare workers carry an average of 7 essential items in their scrub pockets during a shift.

Maintaining Your Scrubs: Longevity and Care



Washing

Wash separately with cold water and mild detergent. Turn inside out.



Drying

Tumble dry on low or hang to dry to prevent shrinking.



Avoid Fabric Softener

It reduces the effectiveness of moisture-wicking properties.



Stain Removal

Treat immediately with stain remover. Use bleach alternative for colors.

Invest in high-quality scrubs designed to withstand frequent washing. Proper care extends lifespan and maintains appearance.



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
